



Copyright statement of European Physiotherapy Guidelines for Parkinson's Disease.

In this statement we want to clarify a misperception/miscommunication among members of the ER-WCPT about the copyright of the 'European Physiotherapy Guidelines for Parkinson's Disease'. This guideline is also known and cited as: Keus SHJ, Munneke M, Graziano M, et al. European Physiotherapy, Guideline for Parkinson's disease. 2014; KNGF/ParkinsonNet, the Netherlands.

The document states that all (copy)rights of this guideline are reserved to the owners, namely KNGF and ParkinsonNet. It also states that no part of this guideline may be reproduced, transmitted or stored in a retrieval system of any nature, in any form or by any means, without prior permission in writing of the copyright owner. It also states that the guideline is freely available on www.parkinsonnet.info/euguideline. This link may be used without prior permission.

Both KNGF and ParkinsonNet do not have the intention to hamper implementation of this guideline at national levels among members of the ER-WCPT. Our reason to place the guideline on one central place was to reduce the chance that the guideline was (mis)used in a context that both the KNGF and ParkinsonNet did not want.

Here, we want to state that physiotherapy associations who are member of the ER-WCPT have the permission from both copyright holders to publish the guideline on their website under the following conditions. The first condition is that both copyright holders are informed by email (international@parkinsonnet.info) about the location where the guideline is placed. The second condition is that the copyright holders can withdraw the permission if the document is placed in a context that could lead to reputation problems for both copyright holders. The third condition is that the physiotherapy association is responsible for updates on their site.
