


How to use the SESL tool




Example of multiple selections





After reading and agreeing to the Terms and Conditions, a summary of your practice selections will appear. You will then need to scroll down and select Stage 1




You will see a range of statements that describe your level of understanding. There are also E-Bite learning materials that have been designed to support your understanding of factors to consider – just click on the button














After completing the questionnaire, a summary of your responses will be shown, when you are ready select 'submit'.
